MDT Information Sharing

As part of improvements to the way we work, Robert Street Surgery is introducing multi-disciplinary team meetings (called MDTs) in the practice, to better co-ordinate the health and social care for some of our most complex patients.

This means that instead of care and services being managed by the teams via a succession of letters and phone calls, the key professionals will meet with the GPs, with the aim of providing quicker, more holistic and better co-ordinated care.

The MDTs membership will include a GP, District Nurse, Social Worker, Community Long Term Conditions Clinical Nurse Specialist, Community Psychiatric Nurse, Primary Care Mental Health Practitioner, Physiotherapist, Occupational Therapist, Falls Service, Community Heart Failure Clinical Nurse Specialist, PIVOT and PAVS (Community Connector). At these meetings relevant clinical information about these complex patients will be shared among the team and the outcomes of the meetings will be documented in patient records.
